Dress For The Weather

Fall and winter weather can be unpredictable - it's best to have a few outfit ideas lined up for your shoot so you know you'll have something appropriate to wear on the day of.

If you feel cold in your photos, you'll likely look cold in your photos. Likewise, if you're dressed in a winter jacket and it's 20C you might find yourself looking rather sweaty in your photos!

Avoid Wearing White in the Snow

If there's snow on the ground and you're wearing white you'll disappear in the photos. Consider a light grey instead, and consider integrating a bright colour or two into your wardrobe (it will really pop against the monotone winter landscape).

Avoid Matching Outfits

While choosing outfits that compliment each other is absolutely the way to go, you don't want to be wearing the same thing.


Don't Bring Too Much Stuff


















Accessories
